What at term we've had! With COVID and a collection of other cold and flu like illnesses impacting both staff and students, we still managed to fit a lot into this term. I'd like to recognise the amazing work of our teachers and support personnel who have continued to engage our students in the curriculum, as well as commit to additional extra curricula activities. Book Week parade, athletics events, swimming lessons, open night, community assemblies, Indonesian Day, just to name a few. We thank our families for being incredibly supportive this term, with so much happening. Next term is looking just as busy, so please make sure you constantly check the term planner, which will be sent out via Connect each time it is updated or changed, and will also be posted on the school website. We are going to be running our re-scheduled Boost Program again next term, for interested parents of students in Kindy, Pre-Primary and Year 1. The 'Boost Program' is delivered by Speech Pathologists and provides information to parents of children in Kindergarten to Year 1 about how literacy skills develop, and what you can do at home to support literacy learning. This is a free program, with two workshops held at school on *Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> November and Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November from 2.00pm to 5.00pm* in the staffroom, with afternoon tea provided. Parents are required to attend both workshops. More information will be sent out via Connect on Monday Week 2.

The school Board has been very busy this term, and the Board Spotlight will be sent to parents later this week with details of what's been happening. We will have two vacant positions on the Board in 2023. One to commence in Term 1 and the other in Term 2. The school will be sending out the expression of interest pack for parents interested in nominating for a position on the Board in Week 2 next term via Connect.

Staff at South Padbury PS have been discussing the importance of play in their teaching and learning program. Looking at the opportunities they provide for students during the school day, and how that links with important research on children's brain development and play/game time. Please go to our school website, head to the Teaching and Learning tab, and check out our Let's Play! Information.

Congratulations to Mila W and Noah G who were the inaugural recipients of our 'Be the Change' award at last week's assembly. We are excited to be recognising students who through their actions are making a difference to others and for themselves.

# 2023 School Charges and Contributions

#### 2023 SCHOOL CHARGES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

The South Padbury Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2023 The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow you to calculate all costs that may be incurred throughout the school year.

## 1. Voluntary Contributions

The total amount of contributions parents/caregivers are being asked to pay have been set at \$40.00 per student which is in line with the School Education Regulations 2000. The voluntary contribution is capped at a maximum of \$120.00 per family for a family of 3 or more children.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the curriculum learning areas. While the contributions are voluntary the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution to the cost of supplementing funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth governments. It is therefore vital for the school to receive your family's contribution. Your contribution will be used to supplement school funding for the purchase of resources needed in the provision of the learning program activities. The table below gives you the breakdown of where we will direct your voluntary contribution to.

PEAC Students can choose from a range of ~45 courses of varying costs. PEAC Course range in cost from \$10 to \$100 per Round,

Year 4 PEAC Induction Day for 2023 is for identified Year 4 students (Induction day for these students will be held during December 2022) Cost \$50.00.

Early Years Extension Program for Years 1, 2 and 3 is \$10 per year

Round 1 for Year 5 students is an introduction to PEAC course and costs \$15.

Year 5 Round 2 and Round 3 PEAC course costs \$20.00-\$200.00 per year.

Year 6—3 Rounds of PEAC course costs \$30.00—\$300.00 per year.

The schedule includes costs associated with:

Specific learning activities and available to all students, but conditional on a payment being made e.g. Incursions, excursions.

Specific learning activities available to selected students, but conditional on a payment being made e.g. PEAC, Music program, etc.

Other activities available to students, but conditional on a payment being made e.g. Camps, etc.

#### 3. Items For Personal Use

The list of items for personal use will vary from student to student and includes:

Pupil requirements for all students and used in lessons e.g. stationery items, calculator, etc.

Pupil requirements recommended but not essential for all students e.g. tissues, art shirt, etc.

Pupil requirements for selected students and not directly part of the educational program e.g. class photographs, Year 6 leavers' shirts, etc.

All materials can be purchased through Campion, however you are not obliged to use this supplier. Your child will need to have the listed materials each school day so it will be necessary to replace some items, such as pens or pencils, throughout the year. Campion pre ordered personal items lists will be distributed on Monday 5 December. Copies of these lists are available from the front office or on the school website.

BYOD Year 3 to 6 students for 2023 are asked to provide their own iPad for the BYOD program. The iPad does not need to be new but does need to run the most current iOS software (iOS 15 at the time of publishing). IPads minis are not recommended. The list of current iPad models which support iOS can be found at <a href="https://support.apple.com/en-us/HT212712">https://support.apple.com/en-us/HT212712</a> The most basic model costs around \$500 new.

More details on the BYOD program and iPads will be discussed in Term 4's BYOD parent information session.

The South Padbury Primary School P & C Association voluntary approved request will be \$30.00 per family. Please remember when you are paying the P & C Voluntary Contribution this is a per family contribution, and is not paid per child.
