The children are also reading "The Iron Man" by Ted Hughes.












My Robot

Our Tiny Forest which is part of the Miyawaki Forest Outreach Program that Dr Grey Coupland undertakes with our students is one of three finalists in the Innovation in Citizen Science category of the National Australian Museum Eureka Prizes. The Eureka Prizes are awarded annually by the Australian Museum, Sydney, to recognise individuals and organisations who have contributed to science and the understanding of science in Australia. The award winners will be announced on the 23rd of August.

Our School Community Charter focus area this term is 'Be Involved'. For parents this may look like volunteering at school in any small way, working in partnership with staff and each other, supporting the P and C, attending school functions or encouraging your children to have a go at something new, or help out others in getting a job done. This is particularly relevant as we head towards our Faction carnivals, which requires both students and parents to be involved. Keep an eye out for Connect notices or Facebook posts asking for volunteers to do something small or pitch in to make the day a success for our students.

As previously mentioned, the school was successful in gaining some project funding to promote reconciliation in schools. Mrs Tye has engaged an indigenous artist who has created panels of the 6 Noongar seasons for the school. He will be bringing the panels into school this week and each class will be helping the artist finish off the panels with their own small addition. The panels will be mounted on the wall above the bike racks.

Congratulations to Grace H from TA 13 on winning the school's 'Be the Change' Award at last week's assembly. What a remarkable and empathetic student who truly impacted another student with her empathy and kindness.

The school would very much appreciate if community members could keep an eagle eye on the school if passing by, over weekends and of evenings. We do have a group of local children who frequent the site and leave behind drug and smoking paraphernalia and rubbish many weekends which are having to be cleaned up by others.
